## **Learning Log Activities for Restless Earth**

- Imagine you have been awarded a medal for extreme bravery during a major natural disaster. Write a recount of the event and how you came to receive the award.
- Write an acrostic poem using the letters from the word VOLCANO, EARTHQUAKE or HURRICANE
- Create a 3D model of a volcano. (No more than 30cm high!).
- Create a fact file about a famous natural disaster other than Mount Vesuvius.
- Make a glossary. Pick a type of natural disaster and List 10 key words and write the definitions.
- Write and perform a song based on volcanoes.
- Draw and label your own invention that would protect a village from a volcanic eruption. Explain how it works.
- Bake some cookies or cakes inspired by a type of natural disaster.
- Investigate where different volcanoes are and label them on a world map (I am happy to print one for anyone who wants one - just send me a message)
- Get arty create a picture that shows the devastation of a natural disaster. This could be a drawing, a painting, collage - get creative.
