## **Learning Log Activities for Love Your Planet**

- Create a picture out of recycled products.
- Make a word search of all the words connected with looking after the environment. Here are some ideas to start you off: reduce, reuse ,recycle, repair ,renewable energy and environment.
- Create a survey to find out how many people recycle? You will need to record your results in a tally chart. Once you have collected your results you can make a bar chart. Maybe you could ask people if they recycle always, sometimes or never.
- Make a poster to persuade people to recycle.
- Make your own space rocket using a plastic bottle.
- Keep a diary over the weekend of all the things you did to help the environment. Did you turn the tap off when you brush your teeth? Did you walk/cycle instead of driving to the shops? Did you reuse anything? Did you check if your rubbish could be recycled?
- Write an adventure story about all the adventures a plastic bottle has on its way to the recycling centre. Think about all the places it could end up and the problems it may come across before it is recycled. 'The Adventures of Polly Purple Fruit Shoot' could be an idea for the title of your adventure story.
- Make a poster displaying all the different types of renewable energy.
- Draw or make something that could be made out of other objects. Someone once made a jacket out of seatbelts!
