Key Ideas

Using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time	We will use words like- long ago, in the Victorian era, in the past, recently, modern, present, today etc to discuss the passing of time.
Place events into a chronological framework	Children will be able to place dates onto our large classroom timeline.
Recognise and talk about similarities between life at different periods in history	Children will recognise the differences and similarities between seaside holidays from the past and today. They will discuss their holidays and consider why holidays have changed.

Key words	Explanation
Modern	relating to the present or recent times
Promenade	a paved public walk, typically one along the seafront at a resort
Punch and Judy	an English puppet show presented on the miniature stage of a tall collapsible booth traditionally covered with striped canvas. The show was probably introduced from the Continent in the 17th century.
Pier	a platform on pillars projecting from the shore into the sea, typically incorporating entertainment arcades and places to eat
Traditional	existing in or as part of a tradition; long-established
Bathing machines	a wheeled hut drawn to the edge of the sea, used for changing in and bathing from
