Grammar

conjunction	A conjunction can be used to link two words or phrases together. The French conjunction ou means the same as the English conjunction or and is used in the same way.
capital letters	In English and French, it is usual to capitalise the names of monuments or landmarks eg. the Eiffel Tower, la Tour Eiffel.
shared word	The abbreviation no. is used as a number label in English and French (eg. no,1). Its origin is the Latin word numero.
ligature	A ligature is two or more connected letters to indicate a single sound. The ligature œ occurs in French words such as cœur (heart), sœur (sister) and œuf (egg). Ligatures used to be included in some English words eg. phœnix , but they are now rarely seen in English.
